Re: Please approve CPX and GLX in 2012-2015 TIP

To Sean Pfalzer and the MPO Transportation Planning and Programming Committee:

We are writing on behalf of the Friends of the Community Path, a regional group with ~1000 members. Our mission is to extend the Community Path in Somerville 2.1 miles eastward to Cambridge at North Point where existing trails connect with the 23-mile Minuteman Bikeway network to the 23-mile Charles River path network. This Community Path Extension (CPX) will then result in almost 50 miles of continuous path network through 11 Boston MPO cities and towns, with multi-modal connections with the future Green Line extension.

Additional 2012 TIP funding for the Community Path, Cedar St. to Lowell St.

We wish to thank the CTPS staff for recommending the additional funding in the 2012 TIP for the upcoming construction of the next ¼-mile section of the Community Path, from Cedar-to-Lowell Streets in Somerville. We therefore request by this July 24 deadline that the MPO board approve this CPX inclusion in the 2012 TIP, the first extension of the CPX in 18 years! This segment is also extremely significant since the CPX begins to dovetail here with the Green Line Extension (GLX) route, by the Lowell Street GLX station.

Support for the Green Line Extension

We also wish to express our support for the \$66 million in GLX funding in the 2012-2015 TIP and ask that it be approved.

Please Identify Funding for the CPX in future TIPs and LRTP as Part of GLX Project

The CPX is, on its own, an amazing, stand-alone bike/ped project;

- Creating regional bike/ped connections to 11 Boston MPO cities and towns
- Passing through the middle of the most densely populated City in New England (Somerville)
- Connecting the environmental and economic justice neighborhoods of East Somerville and East Cambridge, respectively,
- Reaching the economic and tourist hub of Boston and its jewel, the Charles River and its shore paths.

Additionally, there are even more profound benefits of the CPX as part of the GLX project, due to the combined GLX/CPX design and synergy. As you know, we consider the CPX an integral part of the GLX project and we continue to urge MassDOT to include the full CPX in the GLX plans and budgets (the CPX would only increase the cost by about 2%). There is growing recognition by others that this is warranted and cost effective, as pieces of the CPX are increasingly being included as part of the ongoing GLX design plans. (see summary attached.)

However, additional funding will still be needed in future TIPs to complete the remaining three sections of the CPX in between the 4 GLX stations and not yet included in the GLX plans. At this time, only about 7,000 feet (or 1.3 miles total) are not funded by the GLX or present TIP funding. The amount of funding required to complete these 3 sections of the CPX will be estimated when the 30% GLX design is complete in the coming months; we estimate it will be in the range of \$10 to \$20 million depending on the amount of shared infrastructure built as part of the GLX.

We therefore urge the MPO Board to include full funding in relevant TIPs and in the LRTP for the completion of the CPX as part of the GLX – with the CPX funding directly corresponding to the GLX phasing, from Lowell Street all the way to Lechmere/North Point, as follows:

- Phase 2 of the GLX construction (projected years 2013 to 2016) includes the GLX from Lechmere Station to Washington Street Station. Thus, in the case of the 2013-2016 TIP, this means including CPX construction funding there during the same years. Unlike the rest of the CPX, there is currently no funding for this CPX bridge from the Brickbottom area to the existing North Point paths that lead to the Charles River. Funding especially needs to be allocated for this section to make this critical connection to Boston.

- Phase 4 of the GLX construction (projected years 2014 to 2019) is from Washington St. Station to College Ave. We therefore request CPX construction funding from Washington Street to Lowell Street during the same years, from Washington St. to Lowell Street.

I am commenting here on Mitigation projects for Green Line (GLX) delays and on your GreenDOT policy. In particular, I wish to support the Community Path Extension (CPX).

Whether as GLX Delay Mitigation, as an integral part of the GLX, to support GreenDOT goals, or on the CPX's own merits, I urge you to fully fund the design and construct the CPX from Lowell Street all the way to Lechmere/North Point -- and not just to Inner Belt. Currently, the Inner Belt-to-Lechmere CPX design and subsequent construction are not funded in the GLX project budget. This final link, over the Fitchburg line tracks, to the existing paths at Lechmere/North Point is essential for CPX connectivity with Cambridge, Boston and the Charles River path network.

The CPX meets SIP requirements, along with GreenDOT, Healthy Transportation Compact, and Mode Shift goals. It is a first-rate regional project with enormous environmental justice and economic benefits that will be enduring. The CPX is in the GreenDOT Implementation Plan as part of the BayState Greenway Priority 100 miles, and as such should be funded in full as soon as possible.

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

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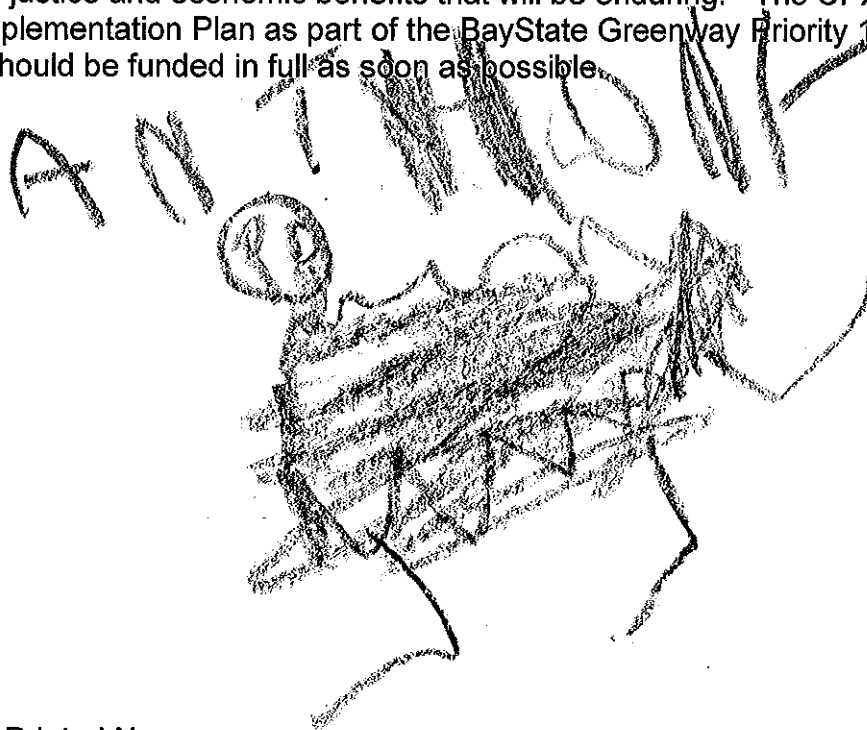
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
